The Sample shows how it is possible for 5 members to all get graded from a 6 pool of equal status persons (15 contests).

If we also consider the possibility of some 7 point draws and some veterans with 2 wins and less than 30 points, this means all 6 members could be considered for upgrade.

In addition some contestants could have 2 ippons and 2 or more wazari making over 34 points – which is not a normal condition of promotion but would be considered.

Therefore pools of 5 will be the maximum for grading assessments.

For 6 persons fight two pools of three and where justified a change over of 1st and 2nd to fight 1st and 2nd from the other pool, making maximum of only 8 contests. This method is also preferable from the number of contests.

Likewise:

For 7 or 8 persons, use 2 pools. For 9 persons normally use 4 and 5 pool etc.
