



Protocol for Presenting Kata on the Day of Contest.

From 1st January 2014 the Kata required for grading after successful contest results, MUST be performed ON THE DAY or before.

1. Failure to present Kata on the day will mean no promotion and no time allowance will be given to present Kata at a future date. **(No Subject to Kata).**
2. If however a reasonable Kata demonstration is attempted on the day, showing pre-training evidence, then time to resubmit Kata may be allowed. This will be entirely at the discretion of the Assessor/s. **(Classified as Revalidation of Kata).**
3. Failure to present Kata will mean contest scores will only count in the points scoring system (requiring 60 accumulated points). However on completion of the 60 accrued points, Kata and Syllabus will still be required.
4. BJC Kata booklets are available from Head Office:
 - a) Nage-No-Kata and Katame-No-Kata.
 - b) Ju-No-Kata.
 - c) Kime-No-Kata.
 - d) Kaeshi-No-Kata.
 - e) Kodokan-Goshin-Jutsu.

Kodokan training videos are also available to view identifying key points on all seven Kata. This will give members an insight into the etiquette, principles, sequence and dojo displacement.

Kata pre-qualification – the key points will be:

5. Members can pre-qualify their syllabus Kata with a 12 months validity. With evidence of the completed Kata Assessment form, duly signed and dated by the Assessor.
6. Accredited Kata Assessors will assess these awards to their level.
