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Introduction

The BJC Syllabus 3.0 Feb 2014 is issued for immediate use by Candidates.

Assessment will be according to FPJ (Fundamental Principles of Judo) Coaching methods.

All Candidates and Assessors must have a current BJC Licence.

Individual 'Grading Cards', 'Workbooks' and 'Guidelines to Coaches and Assessors' will be available as separate documents.

This Syllabus is intended to encourage a higher level of competence in basic foundation judo. The requirements for the 'beginner' grades for the Primary, Junior and Senior syllabi are all similar and will require more time to; learn, practice and improve, whilst simultaneously providing students with motivation and satisfaction as they develop their techniques.

Seniors have an option to follow the grade stripe stages similar to Primary and Junior grades with one, two or three tabs for each grade up to green belt 3rd kyu. Seniors have a personal choice to display their grade or not, using RED tabs on a white, yellow or orange belt.

Competitive randori at club level is not recommended until reaching green tabs for Primaries or orange belt for Juniors and Seniors .

Periods between grades:

The standard period between each tab/grade is 3 months with 12 session attendances.

Coaches/Assessors may use their discretion as to what grade level new members are integrated into the system and this may initially mean jumping some grades over a number of gradings during the starting period of new members. However once the correct grade level is found coaches/assessors should try and keep to grade/periods specified in the syllabus.

The period between contest 1st kyu and 1st dan remains at 1 year.

The BJC Aims

BJC Dan Grading Requirements

Contest Grading 1st Dan to 5th Dan

All dan grades must be recommended to the President for promotion.

All dan grading will be in accordance with the latest issues of:

- 1. BJC Working Instruction W.I. 01 (Issue 3.3 at May 2013)
- 2. Kata requirements (130404 Senior Kata V01.2 at May 2013)

The contest requirements:

- a. To successfully apply Ippon or Wazari judo techniques against, three contestants of one's own grade or the permitted substitutions for any unavailable grades.
 - i. Either in a pool of four or more, where the contestants must be of equal; grade, 'contest age' and gender.
 - ii. Or against a line up of three or more contestants of equal; grades, 'contest age' and gender.
- b. There are two categories of Contest Age;
 - iii. The 'Active contest age' for male and female is considered as 16 to 34 years old.
 - iv. The 'Veteran contest age' for male and female is considered as 35 years or more.
- c. Judo contest is only allowed within one's own gender.

Substitution of unavailable grades:

- d. The following substitutions are permitted, as equivalent grades, at the discretion of the Assessor, who will observe these conditions:
- e. Substitution value for each unavailable grade is two of the next grade below and if applicable, any unavailable substituted grades, will be further substituted by two of the next grade below that.

- f. In a Line-up: Substitution will not normally extend more than two grades below the contestant's grade.
- g. In a Pool: Substitution will not normally exceed more than one grade below contestant's grade.
- h. For 1st and 2nd Dan examination there must be at least one other equal in; grade, contest age and gender.
- i. For 3rd and 4th dan examination there must be at least two others equal in; grade, contest age and gender.
- j. For 5th dan examination there must be at least three others equal in; grade and gender but not necessarily in contest age.

NOTES:

k. The Assessor may also consider, on the grading day, to use the new grade values of any successful contest grades deemed worthy of promotion, but not necessarily promoted at that time.

Grading 6th Dan and above

- l. Members are considered for 6th dan and above entirely at the discretion of the President.
- m. There is not an option for BJC contest promotion to 6th Dan and above.
- n. Normally a minimum period of 10 years will apply but this may be extended to 20 years or more depending on the member's age, considered loyalty, contribution to the BJC and other factors, as so assessed and determined by the President.
- o. The President may delegate these promotion responsibilities to his chosen representative.
